The Next Step: Getting Your Work Produced

You've poured your heart, soul and brain into a new piece of theatrical genius. What do you do next? How do you bring it to the attention of producers and audiences? Whether you're self-producing or submitting to established companies, getting your work produced is almost always a challenge. Join Philadelphia playwright, **Jacqueline Goldfinger**, for an hour long conversation about how to transfer your work successfully from the page to the stage. This workshop will begin at 12:45 pm on Saturday, August 6th, directly following the 12:00 pm showing of *SIMONE*.

Practical Aesthetics: Connecting the Intellectual and the Visceral

Join **Alex Keiper** in the exploration of Practical Aesthetics as she returns for her second year as a teaching artist with the Philadelphia Women's Theatre Festival! Practical Aesthetics is all about taking the guess work out of acting. Going through a very clear and simple structure, the actor learns how to observe in the moment and go after what they want. Participants will learn to use breath and accept the impulses of their partners and how to apply the technique directly. There's no fluff, no smoke, no mirrors. This hourlong workshop will encourage actors to make way for honest and fearless moments with their scene partners. Originally established at The Atlantic Acting School, William H. Macy and David Mamet have created a technique that offers consistency and allows for a full commitment to honesty. This workshop will begin at 7:15 pm on Saturday, August 6th, directly following the 7:00 pm performance of BUZZFEED, DONALD TRUMP, & DEAD BLACK KIDS.

Sparked by an obsession with the larger implications of a toothbrush holder (yes, a toothbrush holder), *RECALCULATING* explores the complicated relationships between seemingly run-of-the-mill objects and the people they represent and/or replace in our lives. From first dates to parting conversations, we watch Girl navigate through her world and her struggle to detach herself from the baggage that disrupts her journey.

RECALCULATING seeks to explore not only the comfort and the curse of "stuff", but the struggle against becoming stuck by prescribed

notions of what an object or person is intended for. If a toothbrush holder is designed for a certain purpose, what happens when that purpose no longer exists? If a Girl is assigned a purpose in life, what happens when she is no longer satisfied with prescribed notions and decides to change directions? What risks do we face when we swim upstream?

RECALCULATING runs approximately 35 minutes.

In 1980, Molly Rush, a Pittsburgh housewife and mother of six, walked into a G.E. plant in King of Prussia, PA and took a hammer to the nosecone of a nuclear warhead in protest of the buildup of our nuclear arsenal. She and her fellow activists, The Plowshares 8, including Daniel and Philip Berrigan, went to trial and spent time in prison, and the world was pulled back from the brink of nuclear annihilation for the time being. MOLLY'S HAMMER is the fictionalized story of these events told through the lens of Molly's marriage and the competing narratives of Molly and her husband Bill, a working class steel worker who's only goal is to stop his wife from sacrificing herself to save the world.
